2011 General Information and Terms of Reference

GENERAL INFORMATION

- A. The 2011 bursary year begins January 1, 2011. No applications will be accepted or processed before this date.
- B. Any interested and qualified student must write to the State Bursary Chairman, at the following address, to request a bursary application form:

All applications are numbered and tracked; no photocopied applications will be accepted. No one other than the student may request an application.

- C. Completed applications, including a short personal resume must be received by the Bursary Chairman on or before June 30, 2011 to be considered for the 2011 bursary program.
- D. The terms of reference listed are general guidelines only. The Foundation President may, at his discretion, award bursaries based upon special circumstances or needs.
- E. Thirty (30) bursaries valued at \$500.00 each are available.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

- 1. The Bishop Thomas J. Lobsinger, OMI Memorial Bursary is available to all Roman Catholic students residing in the province of British Columbia, Canada.
- 2. Receipt of a bursary from the Foundation in any prior year disqualifies the applicant.
- 3. The deadline for receipt of completed applications is June 30, immediately preceding the academic year. (Note: Bursary applications must be completed and received by June 30, but can be applied for after January 1, 2011).
- 4. Applicants must be enrolling in the second or subsequent year of higher education at any legally recognized institute of higher learning, beyond the secondary school level in British Columbia, Canada.
- 5. Proof for the September 2011 registration, in the form of a tuition receipt from a university or other recognized institute of higher learning, will be required by the State Bursary Chairman from successful applicants before bursary cheque can be issued.
- 6.Bursaries are tenable at any legally recognized educational institute of higher learning, beyond the secondary level in British Columbia, Canada.
- 7. Applicants must be under the age of twenty-five as of the application deadline.
- 8. Applicants who demonstrate a financial need may receive primary consideration.
- 9. The signature of your sponsoring Parish Priest (parish where you are registered as a parishioner) must be on the application form.
- 10. Successful candidates will be notified by the State Bursary Chairman before the fifteenth (15th) of August of that same year.
- 11. Applications will be sent only to students who apply in writing to the State Bursary Chairman. Completed applications, along with a short personal resume and Baptism certificate, must be returned by June 30.
