CATCHING UP:

UPCOMING EVENTS/GRAND KNIGHTS REPORT:

First of all, our newest and youngest member Bro. Ian Walston completed his 2nd and 3rd Degrees at a combined ceremony on April 13 at St. Paul's in Richmond. Please mentor him as he grows in the work of the order. He was knighted by Worthy State deputy Wil Wilmot. Both DD Peter Siglos and I attended the ceremony.





Bro. Alain and I just attended the 102 BC and Yukon State Convention in Richmond this weekend. I will share some of the highlights in his report.

-The theme in this Year of Faith was The Door of Faith and our State Chaplain Bishop Gagnon of Victoria elaborated on this in his homilies and talks

-A new State Council was elected by acclamation with the new State Deputy position taken by Bro. Ed Shawchuk

-Emphasis was placed on recruiting 211 more new members in the remaining 2 months of the Fraternal year which roughly works out to 1 new member per month per Council

-The 2nd and 3rd Degree exemplifications will be separated from now on with each District encouraged to form their own 2nd Degree teams. State will be organizing the 3rd Degree Teams.

-There will be a Charity Appeal campaign this year headed by GK Henry Li of St. Francis Xavier Council 10500 in Vancouver. A tentative selection of prizes is as follows:\$50,000 1st Prize, Ford F150 2nd Prize, Chrysler 200 3rd Prize, Chev. Malibu 4th Prize.

Our Council's share of the net proceeds of the last Charity Appeal campaign is \$3468.63 which can now be allocated to charities that meet the strict guidelines of the BC Gaming Commission. Once again all Councils are encouraged to place more emphasis on individual donations to the Corpus Fund which was instituted in 2002 with the goal of \$2million. To this end all members will receive a donation form with addressed envelope to mail in their donation. The proceeds of the Corpus Fund are not governed by the restrictive rules of the BC Gaming Commission and allow us to allocate funds to causes of our own preference. This will eventually replace the Charity Appeal Campaign. Last year \$64,670.22 was raised in the Corpus Fund from donations by councils and individuals with the largest single donations of \$52,280 from State Council and \$1000 from an individual.

There will be another Man Alive Conference on Oct. 5 this year as the last one proved to be very successful bringing many lapsed Catholic men back into the practice of the faith and setting an example in their families I will pass on the official Convention Report when I receive it from State.

Last of all, the Fraternal year will end at the end of June and there will be an election of officers at our June meeting. All incumbents will be contacted as well to determine their willingness to stand for another term.

A cheque will be presented at Convention by our worthy Grand Knight Michael.

Walk for Special Olympics was a huge success surpassing last year's donation by over \$600.00. This year our Knights (and wives) raised \$2224.00 which again will be presented to Jasmine Allen, representing Special Olympics B.C. She also will be attending the Knights of Columbus Convention on Saturday April 27th, where a presentation of monies will be given by State and all other councils that participated in some sort of fund raiser.
