



Christ is Risen! Indeed He is Risen!

Dear Brother Knights of Columbus!

What an incredible few weeks this has been! We have journeyed through the Great Fast - Lent, followed the Passion of our Lord during Holy Week, and on Easter Sunday together with family and friends cried out in joy: "Christ is Risen! Truly He is Risen!" Furthermore, together as Knights many of us have attended a rewarding and successful State Convention. To top it off, in these last days the world has rejoiced with the canonization of Saints John XXIII and John Paul II.

In Vancouver, Archbishop Michael Miller hosted a special liturgical celebration attended by thousands united in prayers and hymns of joy with those in Rome at St. Peter's Square, and with Catholic faithful around the world. It was truly a spiritually uplifting experience. The Knights were well represented and I was honoured to also be one of the concelebrants of the Holy Mass along with Archbishop Miller and our new Nuncio, Archbishop Luigi Bonazzi. On this, his first visit to British Columbia, we were most honoured to have him as a guest at the State Convention's Saturday evening banquet.

In celebrating the canonization of these two holy popes, we reflect on the role of leadership that they provided for the Church. Leadership in the Church, of course, springs from our Lord Himself. Jesus taught us what it meant to be a pastor-servant-leader. He told His disciples at the Last Supper, "...the greatest among you must behave as if he were the youngest, the leader as if he were the one who serves. For who is the greater: the one at table or the one who serves? The one at table, surely? Yet here am I among you as one who serves!" (Luke 22:26-27). What powerful words our Lord has spoken about leadership.

I think that in today's world, in our communities, in our State Councils and Assemblies, parishes and dioceses or eparchies, one of the most important things a leader must do is LISTEN: for advice, for feedback, for what the Spirit is saying through our brothers and sisters. Failure to listen extinguishes the spark of enthusiasm that is necessary to make any Christian community a vibrant place to encounter the living Christ.

If you are in a position of leadership in your parish, community, Council or Assembly, perhaps you might try to remember that sometimes leadership seems like a thankless task. I wonder how many times our Knights of Columbus leaders feel that leadership is a burden carried with a heavy heart rather than with the joy that comes from supporting and serving others. Well, I suppose that this happens to the best of us. Even so, just when we think the cup is mostly empty, we are reminded just how incredible people can be, and how wonderful and blessed is this brotherhood we belong to. When we look for the positive, when we look for the sparks of enthusiasm, when we listen to the Spirit speaking through others, that is when we remember why we have agreed to serve as leaders and accept our responsibilities as opportunities to do what we love as Knights, and that is to serve those whom we love! That's what it means to serve as leaders in the Church!

I believe that Saints John XXIII and John Paul II are powerful examples today of that very concept of "Servant Leadership". Both these wonderful Pastors, have in my lifetime fanned many sparks of enthusiasm for the Gospel, for saving souls for the Lord! Let their lives of service and ministry - inspire you too, Dear Brothers!

May our Lord bless our State Directors in the British Columbia and Yukon State Council, along with all of those who continue to provide leadership on both the State and local

Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP)

Through the Knights of Columbus Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP), councils, assemblies and Squires circles "adopt" one or more seminarians or postulants and provide them with financial assistance and moral support.

RSVP money is used by seminarians and those in religious formation for tuition and books, car insurance and maintenance, travel during vacations, emergency expenditures and other living expenses. Knights provide more than financial support, though. Members write letters to students, sponsor dinners for them, Invite them to join the Order and, most importantly, pray for vocations.

The facts of the overall program speak for themselves --- more than \$60 million in support has been provided to more than 98,000 seminarians over the program's 33 year existence.

Qualifying councils and assemblies receive a \$100 refund for every \$500 donated, up to a limit of \$2,000 donated to an individual, while the refund for Squires is \$20 for every \$100 donated.

St. Monica Council on VOCATIONS PROGRAM

Council 12861 has a very active vocation program which has three main activities:

To morally and financially support seminarians who are actively enrolled in seminaries;

To encourage/invite young boys of the parish to a weekend live-in seminar in Seminary of Christ the King, and;

To invite young girls of the parish to a daytrip to visit the Westminster Abbey and St. Clare Monastery, both in Mission, BC.

The council starts with the youth because it believes that the first signs and awareness of vocation to priesthood and to consecrated life are discerned in the early years of one's childhood. Many young boys and girls feel the invitation from God at their tender young age. However, because of their youth and because of lack of proper guidance, they usually do not interpret and do not know how to foster this invitation. The council's vocation program, at the very least, helps the young men and women of St. Monica parish to recognize the discernment and encourages them to take little steps to open their hearts and minds to the invitation by visiting spiritual institution such as the Westminster Abbey and the St. Clare Monastery.

The year 2014 is a very active year for all three activities.

The program currently supports one seminarian who had just recently completed his formation year outside the seminary. He made the decision to continue his vocation and currently studying in Rome.

The weekend of February 14-16, 2014 was a good weekend for a group of 6-young men; five from St. Monica parish and one from Immaculate Conception parish in North Delta. They were the boys who attended the live-in seminar at Seminary of Christ the King.

The seminar gave the young men the opportunity to meet and work with resident students of the seminary and other young men from different places in British Columbia and Washington State, who were also searching for God's will.

In the seminar, the young men were exposed to the ways seminarians live their lives in the seminary. Prayers, scripture readings and sharing of personal experiences made their stay very valuable and memorable. However, prayers and work were not the only activities in the seminar. The students and the young men also engaged themselves in social fellowship by attending group singing, sports, talent show and other fun activities. They also toured the grounds of the seminary and witnessed how the monks raise their own livelihood

On Sunday, March 9, 2014, the daytrip for the young girls of St. Monica Parish was completed. Ten young ladies from St. Monica Parish participated in the trip. They were chaperoned by two of their CCD/PREP teachers. Three brother knights took part in this activity and unselfishly volunteered their vehicles for transportation. Another brother joined the trip and gave company and moral support.

The itinerary of the day-trip included:

Attend Sunday Mass at the Westminster Abbey; Audience with Poor Clare Sisters of St. Clare Monastery, and join the Sisters in their mid-day prayer; Break for lunch; Tour of the Westminster Abbey; Tour of the ground of the Seminary of Christ the King.

Attending Mass at the Abbey was something to be remembered by the young girls as most of them experienced it for the first time. The way the Benedictine Monks celebrate Mass was an eye opener for them as it was a bit different from the home parish. The celebrant chanted and sung the entire Mass. The choir was very inviting and very reverend in their part as well. The Mass itself, as a whole, was an experience to be remembered even by those who have attended service at the Abbey previously.

After the Mass, the group took the 5-minute drive to St. Clare Monastery. Sister Frances welcomed and ushered the group to the reception room. Sister Celine, the abbess, and Sister Sofia welcomed everybody and introduced themselves. The girls introduced themselves also. The introduction relaxed everyone and set the girls' mood of openness and started asking questions about the nuns' life and routine inside the monastery. After 20-minutes of questions-and-answers, the group joined the sisters in their mid-day prayer. Praying with the nuns was another experience most, if not all of the girls will remember for a long time. The way the nuns sung the prayers was so contagious that the girls quietly joined them in singing. The prayer lasted 25-minutes.

After the monastery visit, the group stopped for lunch.

After lunch, the daytrip continued with a tour of the Westminster Abbey. Fr. Mark Dumont, OSB, the Abbey's guestmaster was the tour guide himself. Inside the church it was noticeable that there were no images of the station of the Cross. Instead, there were what Fr. Mark called the "leafs". The "leafs" depicted passages in the Bible and the martyrdom of many saints. They also told stories on how papal hierarchy begun. There is so much history in the church that so many questions were asked. When was the church built? Who were the founders of the Benedictine? How many monks are in the Abbey? Who are the brother monks? These were very interesting questions coming from the young girls!

The vocation program is truly very close to the heart of the executives and members of the St. Monica Council. It is strongly supported by the pastor and chaplain, Fr. Anthony Boniface. The live-in seminar for boys and the daytrip for girls are open to all young men and women of the parish, ten to eighteen years of age. For reason that most of the participants to these activities are senior PREP/CCD students, St. Monica Council prepares and organizes the events in coordination with the PREP/CCD ministry of the parish. There is no monetary requirement from the participants. The costs for these activities are all borne by the council.

Praying for vocation to priesthood and consecrated life is the main charge of the St. Monica Council's vocation program. Together with the council's Rosary Night, hosted by a brother knight and his family, held every month, the council hopes that one day soon it will witness a formation of a young man or young woman to accept the invitation and answers the call.
