CATCHING UP:

Grand Knight's Report:

I attended the State Convention, May 4-6 along with Brother Rafael Sevilla. It was amazing to see what we have accomplished over the year, e.g. wheelchair program, coats for kids, Special Olympics, membership growth, charities supported, Squires and Squirette programs, etc. Emphasized trying to get younger members to join to keep Knights of Columbus going. State officers elected were basically the same as last year; Brother Ming Lau was voted in again as State Deputy for BC / Yukon. I presented a cheque for \$2272 for Special Olympics (from our walk-athon) and \$480 for "Pennies for Heaven" for vocations (\$380 collected + \$100 top-up from our council). I would like to thank everyone for their involvement in these initiatives.

For the Charity Appeal raffle tickets, our council sold 350 books and we received a commission of \$700 (\$2.00 per book). As well we will receive a rebate of \$2404.50 which we have to apply for and goes to charities of our choice, usually our parish food bank. It is definitely worth all the effort we put in to sell tickets.

Our next monthly Pancake Breakfast will be held on June 3. Come out and help if you are able – this will be the last breakfast until September.

Sunday, May 27, was our Knights of Columbus catered awards dinner. There were 78 people in attendance including Knights, spouses, friends, Msgr Rossi, and Fr. Rey. The dinner was excellent with roast beef, salmon, salads, desserts, and drinks including wine, punch, coffee, tea, etc. Special thanks to Brother Bruce McLean for organizing this event, and thanks to all the others who helped. I presented Family of the Month awards: Sept. – Chester and Nenita Ostonal, Oct. – Peter & Jenny Finnegan, Nov. – Paul & Suzy Rossi, Dec. – Bob & Carol Murphie, Jan. – Ian & Shannon Williams, Feb. – Chad & Danielle Ciavarro, Mar. – Tarcisio & Emanuela Rossi, Apr. – Michael & Lisa Charron, May – Zvonko & Margaret Basic, June – Coral & Darcie Kopchia. Family of the Year was awarded to Tarcisio & Emanuela Rossi: Tarcisio is our treasurer, who does all the banking for our council, writes cheques and makes deposits. He help with pancake breakfasts, barbeques, and other projects around the parish. He also reads or ushers at Mass. Congratulations Tarcisio & Emanuela!



Also, for the State Convention, I submitted a name for the State Knight of the Year – namely our Brother Bruce McLean. While he didn't win State Knight of the Year, he did win the Unsung Hero Award, which was presented to me on his behalf at the State Convention. I presented this impressive large trophy, engraved, to Brother Bruce at the Awards Dinner.





We will have the election of officers for the next term at the June council meeting, Tuesday, June 12. Please try to attend. I have attached the descriptions of each position and have asked Brother Bob Murphie to run the election. If you would like to run for any of these positions or nominate someone for a particular position, phone Bob at 604-323-3611. It is a great opportunity to learn some new skills and serve others in these unique roles. I can say for myself that I have learned a lot about Council activities through my position as Grand Knight.

Grand Knight

The grand knight is responsible for the welfare of the council. He presides over council meetings, acts as an ex-officio member of all committees, appoints a membership and programming director, convenes officers for a monthly meeting, and ensures all necessary reports are submitted to the state and Supreme Council. He should also be aware of the council's financial status and ensure that his signature appears on all checks drawn.

Deputy Grand Knight

The deputy grand knight is second in command. He assists the grand knight with council affairs and fulfills all duties assigned to him by the grand knight. Should the grand knight be absent from a council meeting, the deputy grand knight will preside. He is chairman of the council's retention committee

Chancellor

The chancellor has a variety of responsibilities. Primarily, he assists the grand knight and the deputy grand knight in the execution of their duties and oversees the council in both their absences. He is charged with strengthening the members' interests in council activities. The chancellor is chairman of the admission committee

Recorder

The recorder is similar to a court reporter or a secretary. He is responsible for maintaining a true record of all actions of the council and its correspondence. A Recorder's Minute Book (#1403) is available from the Knights of Columbus Supply Department for keeping a record of council meetings.

Treasurer

The treasurer is responsible for the safekeeping and maintaining records of all council funds and accounts. He is responsible for depositing money into the council's accounts and provides a certificate of such monies to the grand knight. He is also responsible for payment of all expenses.

Lecturer

The lecturer is appointed by the grand knight to provide both educational and entertaining programs to the council. He is responsible for the 'Good of the Order' portion of council meetings. In order to provide members with informative and educational programs, he must be knowledgeable and aware of all council programming.

Advocate

The advocate is the legal representative of the council and serves as the council's attorney at trials and investigations of any interest to the council. While he does not need to be a member of the legal profession, he should be familiar with the council by-laws, the Order's Charter, Constitution and Laws (#30), Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting (#1937), and Robert's Rules of Order.

Warden

The warden is the 'watchdog' for council property and degree paraphernalia, except the property of the financial secretary, treasurer and recorder. He is also responsible for setting up the council chambers for meetings and ceremonial work. During ceremonial exemplifications, he will appoint and supervise guards.

Inside & Outside Guards

The guards have similar responsibilities, but distinct differences. The outside guard tends to the outer door admitting visitors and members to the inner door. Once at the inner door, the inside guard checks to make sure that their membership cards are current.

Board of Trustees

The board of trustees consists of three members elected by the council and the grand knight, who serves as chairman of the board. They oversee the work of the financial secretary and treasurer, and with the deputy grand knight serve on the council's retention committee. During council elections, only the three-year trustee is voted on, with the others moving on to become two and one-year trustees, respectively.

Don't forget the next pancake breakfast on Sunday June 3 and our next council meeting at 8:00 pm on Tuesday, June 12, after rosary (7:10 pm) and Mass (7:30 pm). Please try to attend our council meeting so we can vote in our new executive.

Since this is the last newsletter before our break, I would like to wish everyone a restful and enjoyable summer.
